



The הַכָּמִים brings a disagreement between הַכָּגִי אֱלִיעָזָר and the הַכָּמִים (Sages). יוֹם טוֹב allows one to take a splinter of wood on a יוֹם טוֹב (Festival) and use it as a toothpick. The Sages disagree. They hold that, on a Festival, wood may only be used for kindling fire to cook food, not for other purposes like cleaning teeth.

Why do the Sages not allow wood to be used as a toothpick? Rashi explains the reason. Wood is usually used for making utensils, which is not allowed on Festivals. Wood should therefore be considered מָקַצָּה, "set aside" from being used on a Festival. The Sages, however, allowed wood to be used for kindling fires to cook food on a Festival. But they did not allow wood to be used for any other reason.

רָבָא says something similar. Long slender pieces of wood or metal ("pokers") were used to stir coals fueling a fire. רְבָא rules that a woman may not enter a woodshed to take a piece of wood to use as a poker. This is because wood may not be used for anything other than kindling.

Also, wood that cannot be used for kindling, for example, a wet branch, is $\alpha = \alpha$ and may not be used on a Festival. Even though the wet branch works as fuel for a large fire, since it is not useable for a normal fire, it is "set aside" from being used on a Festival.

A Jito Moment



Starting Fires

Not only is cooking allowed on a Festival, but adding kindling to a fire for cooking is also allowed. But what about creating a new fire? Are we allowed to start a fire for cooking?



The גְּמְרָא explains that starting a fire from scratch is not allowed on a Festival because you are creating something new. Anything new that didn't exist before the Festival but was created on the Festival but was created on the Festival is מַקְצֶה and may not be used. This type of מִקְצֶה is called מִקְצֶה (born).

The מְשָׁנָה says one may not "bring out" (that is, "create") fire from wood or rocks. This is done by creating friction by rubbing pieces of wood or stone against each other. One may not use water to start a fire. Rashi explains that water can be used to start a fire by placing it in a glass dish in the sun. The dish acts as a lens to focus the sun's heat. If straw is placed near the glass, it can catch fire.

Did You Know...

An animal may not be led by a stick on a Festival. This may be because the stick is "מֵקְצֶה" or, "set aside" from being used for anything except as fuel for a fire. Also, by leading an animal with a stick, it looks like one is taking the animal to the market to sell.
