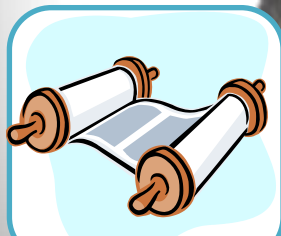

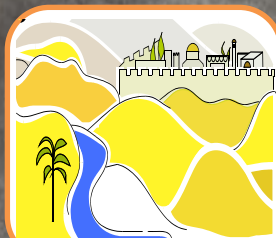

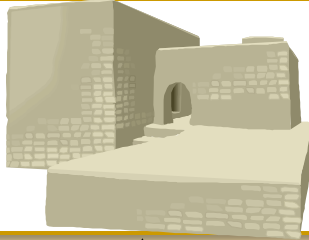
!? **Did You Know...**

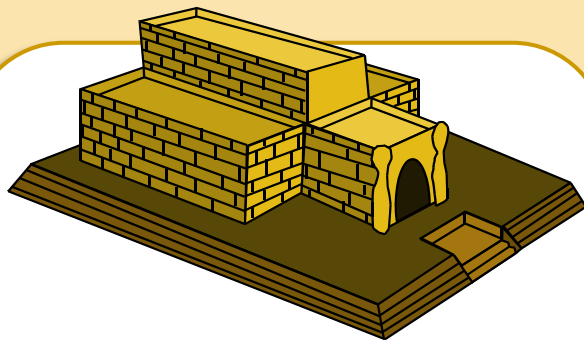

Mr. Hockfeld was very grateful to have his friend pick him up at the hospital after his doctor's appointment. His friend, who thought he would be picking up Mr. Hockfeld for free, was surprised to discover that he had to pay \$20 for hospital parking.

"I'll pay you back of course," said Mr. Hockfeld to his friend. "After all, you didn't know about the parking fee so it isn't fair for you to pay it. I learned in *daf yomi* this morning that if someone borrows clothes from a friend and is wearing them when a close relative dies, he does not tear the clothing even though he normally should if a close relative died. It isn't fair to ruin his friend's clothing since his friend wasn't expecting the clothes to be torn. We see from here that if someone does a good deed for you and doesn't expect it to cost him any money, we cannot let him suffer a loss of property or money."
