



# Inside the Daf

What's the smallest house you've ever been in? However small it was, it probably wasn't less than 4 אַמוֹת long by 4 אַמוֹת wide! (4 אַמוֹת is about 7 feet, or 216 centimeters). Would such a place even be called a "house?"


According to the אָמֶרָא, no. A "house" must be at least 4 אַמוֹת by 4. If it is not, rules in the Torah that apply to a "house" ("בַּיִת") do not apply to the building.

For example:



קאויה The Torah says we must put mays we must put on the doorposts of our "houses", (see יי, Deut. 6,9) since a building less than 4 אַמוֹת by 4 אַמוֹת is not a "house" it would not need a מְזוּוֹהָ.

מְצֶקֶה A מְצֶקֶה (protective fence) must be built along the edge of the roof of one's "house."(see דברים, Deut. 22,8) A house less than 4 אמות squared is not a "house" so it does not need a מֵצְקָה.

were stark green or red markings that would afflict a Jew's "house" for the sin of stinginess (see נמדבר רבה, A house less than 4 by 4 מַמֹּת במחטל cannot contract אַבְעַת (see ניקרא יד,לג-נג (see 14, 33-53).

מעוֹרְבֵי הַמְּלְחְמָה Someone who has built a "house" but has not yet lived in it, does not have to go into battle (see סיים כ,ה-ט, Deut. 20,5-9) If the house is less than 4 אַמוֹת squared he would have to go to battle because it isn't a "house."

## When Is a House Not a House?

On שַׁבְּת (the Sabbath) a person may not travel more than 2000 אַמּוֹת (about 0.7 mi, or 1 km) outside of his city. If a building is within about 70 אַמוֹת (124 ft, or 38 m) of his city, it is considered part of his city. That means he can walk 2000 אַמוֹת from that





In fact, there were small buildings called שבּוּרְגָּנִין used by watchmen or bird hunters (or according to

some, as a rest stop for travelers or for storing produce). בּוּרְגָּנִין are designed for one person to sleep at night. They were made of willow branches and reeds and are only temporary. These בּוּרְגָנִין count as being part of the city.

Can a house less than 4 by 4 ממות in size count as a building that would be part of the city? The גְּמָרָא says no. Why can be part of the city while these small houses cannot? The גְמָרָא answers,

because a house is built to be a place to always live in. A house that is less than 4 אַמוֹת squared is not fit for that so it isn't linked to the city. בּוֹרְצָּנִין are built to be used for one person to sleep in overnight. Since they are fit for that purpose they join to the city.

Did You Know... סוּכָּה says a רַב שְׁמוּאֵל בַּר יִצְחָקּ

must be big enough to hold one's head, most of his body and his table.
