Have you ever heard of a סוּכָּה without any roof at all?

Believe it or not, our מִּשְׁנָה discusses that topic. A סוּכָּה built like a triangular hut, or קָּכְּך (קּכָּה covering) leaning against a wall like a triangle, is valid according to the חַכְּמִים (Sages) who hold a slanted wall counts as a roof. רְבִּי disagrees and holds that these שִּלִיעָנֶר would not be פָּשִׁר (valid) because they have no real roof.





When אַבּיִי mentioned this problem to רב יוֹםף he responded that the Sages never said a slanted wall counts as a roof! The Sages really hold, רב יוֹםף

\said, that a tent-like roof isn't a real roof and therefore being under a tent roof in a סוּבָּה is just as good as being directly under a סוּבָּה

All That "Mat"ters

In the days of the Talmud, reed mats were used as אָכָּף (covering) for אָכָּף But אָכָּף may not be made from anything that can become אָכָּף (impure). Reed mats made to lied on (like a mattress) could become אָמֵא. If, however, it was made to be used as אָכָּף, then it cannot become אָמֵא and may be used as a סוּכָּה covering.

What happens if a reed mat was made without any purpose in mind? Do we treat it like it was made to be lied upon? Or do we treat it as though it was made for TOC?



Did You Know...

If אֶבֶהְ hangs over the back of a אַבָּהְ where there are three walls with an area of 7 אָבָּחִים by 7 אָבָּחִים (the minimum area of a valid אָבָּחִים, about 25 in or 63 cm), the back of the אָבָּיִר would be בְּשִׁר (valid) to use even though there was no intention to make that space into a אַרָּבָּה.

Since large reed mats were usually used for סוּכָּה coverings, if they were made without any use in mind they may be used as קַּבָּר.

תנָא קַמָּא and רַבִּי אֱלִיעֶזֶר disagree about small mats. If they were made without any purpose in mind, תַּנָא קַמָּא says they may not be used as אַכָּדְ while רַבִּי אֱלִיעֶזֶר allows them.
