

# Inside the Daf

Some מְצָוֹת (commandments) we perform while others we have to say. For example, reciting the הַלָּל (praise giving) prayer on festive days is a commandment we say.

What happens if one cannot say this prayer? What happens, for example, if someone is not able to read? The משנה rules that in such a case anyone – even a non-Jewish slave, a woman or a child who are not commanded to recite הַלָּל – can read the prayer and the listener can repeat word-for-word what the reader is saying. By doing so, the listener is able to fulfill his commandment to recite הַלָּל (this rule applies not just for הַלָּל but for anything that needs to be recited).

The גמרא asks what happens if the listener doesn't repeat the words after the reader? Can he still fulfill his requirement to recite הלל?

גבי חייא בר אבא says, yes. As long as he hears the words it is as if the listener said them himself.

The proof for this comes from an incident that happened with King אָשָׁיָהוּ (Josiah). In סַפֶר מִלָכִים בי Book of Kings II) we are told that שָׁפָן (Shaphan) the scribe read from the Torah in front of the king. But just a few verses later we are told that King אשיהו himself read from the scroll! Rather, King אשיהו listened to the scroll

being read and it is considered as if he himself read it. In fact. later is praised יאשיהו for hearing the words of the Torah scroll.

## Did You Know...

When רֵב אַחָא בַּר יַעֲקֹב shook the four species back and forth he would say, "This is an arrow in the eye of the שָׁטָן (evil inclination)." רשיינ explains this is because the evil inclination can now see that he cannot prevent the Jewish people from performing a מִצְנָה (commandment)!

## Interrupting-Meals

Nobody likes to interrupt their meal, but sometimes you have to in order to do a מִצְוָה.

The מְשָׁנָה talks about someone who arrives from a journey late during the סופות holiday and has not yet performed the daily of taking the four species. As מְצְוָה explains, if there would be no time left in the day to take the four species after eating a meal, he must take the four species before beginning to eat. In fact, he would even have to interrupt his meal in order to perform his מִצְוָה

On the other hand, if there would be time left in the day after the meal to perform the commandment of taking the four species, he may eat first and perform the מִצְוָה
