


Inside the Daf

After learning about the practice of circling the Temple altar with אַרֶבוֹת (willow branches) during the סוכות asks where this practice came from.

רָבִּי יוֹחָנֶן and רַבִּי יְהוֹשֵׁעַ בֶּן לֵוִי discuss the source. One says it is a Rabbinic obligation began by the prophets חַנֵּי, מַלְאָכִי (Haggai, Zechariah and Malachi). Another says the עַרְבוֹת עַרְבוֹת ceremony is a custom of the prophets meaning we would not recite a blessing before its performance.

רְבִּי זֵירָא points out that רֲבִּי יוֹחָנֶן himself says that the אֲרְבוֹת ceremony was not begun by the prophets but is rather a הָלְכָה לְמֹשֶׁה מִסִינֵי, an Oral Law given to Moses from Hashem at Sinai. This means the practice was in place hundreds of years before the era of the prophets.

The אָמָרָא concludes that the אַרְבוֹת ceremony that was performed in the Temple is a הַלְּכָה לְמֹשֶׁה מִּסִינֵי . But the maple is a אַרְבוֹת ceremony performed *outside* of the Temple on the seventh day of is a Rabbinic obligation (according to רָבִּי יוֹתָנֶן) or custom of the prophets (רְבִּי יְהוֹשֻׁעַ בֶּן לֵוִי).


Meticulous-in-His-Deeds

The גְּמֶרָא tells of an incident that happened with בָּבִּי אֱלְעָוֶר בַּר צַדוֹק.

A wealthy man who owned villages, vineyards and olive groves came to the rabbi during a שְׁמִיטָה (Sabbatical) year. He said he was paying his workers with olives gr-

own in the שְׁמִיטָה year to hoe his vineyards. The man wanted to know if this was proper.

רבי אֶלְעָזֶר בַּר צְדוֹק told him that this practice is not proper as one cannot sell or use is not proper as one cannot sell or use fruits in business transactions. By paying his workers with שְׁמִיטָה olives, the man was using שִׁמִיטָה produce for business.




Without delay, the man ran back to his fields to put an end to this practice. An amazed רָבִּי אֶלְעָזָר exclaimed, "I have lived in this land for forty years and have *never* seen a man go in the paths of righteousness as

this man does." רָבִּי אֶלְעָזָר was impressed by this man's dedication to put an end to his own wrongdoing.

The man returned shortly after to ask רָבִּי אֶלְעָזָר how to pay his workers properly during the שְׁמִיטָה year. He was told to pay his workers money from his own pocket rather than שִׁמִיטָה produce.

Did You Know...

Usually, a פֿהֵן with a blemish does not participate in Temple services. Nevertheless, בֵישׁ לָקִישׁ him to carry the אֲרָבוֹת around the Temple altar as part of that ceremony.
