



Inside the Daf



The גְּמֵרָא talks about performing סוֹטָה with a סוֹטָה.

A סוֹטָה is a woman whose husband warned her to not go into a private setting with a certain man, but she did so anyway. If she and this man were in the private setting for a certain amount of time, the woman must separate from her husband until certain steps are taken (see במדבר פרק הי, Num. 5 for a description of these steps).


Since she must stop living with her husband, if he is a פֿהֵן she may not eat the מרוּמָה food that only a בֿהֵן and his household may eat.

But even though she no longer lives with her husband, they are still married at this time. So what would happen if her husband were to die childless? Would his bother perform מֲלִיצָה (or מֲלִיצָה)? Or, do we say that since they no longer live as husband and wife, the husband's brother no longer has any connection to the wife

(similar to a divorced wife)?

תְשְׁנָה quotes מַשְּׁנָה that says the brother must perform חֲלִיצָה, but not יבּוּם on the





Remarrying...Her

Once a husband and wife are divorced, he may never remarry her again after she marries another man.

As the Torah says,

דברים כד,ד Deut. 24,4).

Let's say that someone (wrongly) remarried the woman he divorced after she had already married another man (and was then divorced from him or became a widow).

Let's say, after remarrying his ex-wife, he
died childless. Would his brother
have to perform מֲלִיצָה on the remarried wife?

The Sages agree that the divorced wife may not be taken in יבוּם.

Since she is not allowed to remarry her

first husband, she may also not participate in יבוֹם, which is like marriage, with the living brother who acts in place of her first husband.
