




## Inside the Daf

The **מִסְנָה** gives some examples of wives who are allowed to be with their husbands, others who may not be married to their husbands but who may marry their husband's brothers and wives who may not stay married to their husbands nor marry their husbands' brothers. See the chart below for examples.




מתרות ליבמיהן ואסורות לבעליהן

A **כהן** may become engaged to marry a widow, but a **כהן גדול** may not. If a **כהן גדול** becomes engaged to a widow, but his brother is a regular **כהן**, she may not stay with the **כהן גדול** ...but his brother may become engaged to her and even marry her!



מתרות לבעליהן ואסורות ליבמיהן

If an ordinary **כהן** marries a widow but has a brother who is a **כהן גדול**, the brother may not marry the widow...but the husband may stay married to her



אסורות לאלו ולאלו

If a **כהן גדול** marries a widow, and has a brother who is a **כהן גדול**, she may not stay with the **כהן גדול** ...and may not marry his brother!



# Losing Out

Have you ever been punished for doing something you shouldn't have? Did the punishment mean you had something taken away?

The **סוֹפְרִים** (early Sages in the time of the Bible) made a rule that one may not marry not-so-close relatives, like grandmothers. If one marries such a relative, the couple must get divorced. During their marriage the husband would not have to give his wife food or clothing like he would in a regular marriage.



Also, there are things the wife would lose out on after the divorce.

Usually, if a woman brings clothing into a marriage and the husband uses the clothing until it is worn out, the husband would need to return the worn out clothing to her if they divorce. But if a man would marry one

of his not-so-close relatives, he would not have to return these clothes to her.

## A מְדוּת Moment

Sammy was feeling left out. None of the kids at his new school would let him sit at their table at lunch time. Whenever he would try to sit somewhere, he would be told that the place was taken.

One day, the principal of the school addressed the problem and spoke to Sammy's class.

"The students of **רַבֵּי אֶלְעָזָר בֶּן שְׁמוּעַל** excluded all outsiders from their group. They wouldn't let anyone else learn from their teacher! At this school, we aren't like that. We should welcome newcomers with open arms and let them sit with whomever they like."
