




Inside The Daf

Throughout his seven days of separation before יוֹם כָּפוּר, the פֿהֵן גָדוֹל sprinkled the blood (יְרִיקָה), brought the הָטָבַת הַגֵּרוֹת) (הַקְטָרָה), prepared the מְנוֹרָה מְנוֹרָת) and brought the head and the leg (of the קָרְבָּן תָּמִיד הַקְרָבַת) on the altar (קַרְבָּן תָּמִיד הַקְרָבַת).



זְרִיקת הַּדְּם Throwing the blood

The blood from of every קרבן (offering) was collected in a bowl and then dashed onto the sides of the (altar), or poured into its side posts.



הַקְּטָרָה Burning the incense

קטוֹרֶת is the incense offered on the golden altar in the הֵיכָל (Sanctuary) of the בֵּית (Holy Temple). It was offered twice each day; in the morning, and before evening.



הָטְבַת הַנְרוֹת Preparing the candles

In the morning, a שמון would clean out the charred wicks and leftover oil from the מְנוֹרָה 's lamps, and would replace them with fresh wicks and oil.




הַקְּרָבַת קִּרְבָּן תָּמִיד Offering the head and leg

Twice a day, the קְרְבָּן קרְבָּן (daily offering) was sacrificed in the Temple. The פֿתֵן גָדוֹל would burn its head and right hind leg on the seven days before יוֹם כָּפּוֹר.



The Mystery of the Red Heifer



One of the most famous mysteries of the Torah is the פַּרָה אֲדוּמָה (Red Heifer).

The ashes of the red heifer and spring water (מֵי מפאת) are sprinkled on a טָמֵא (impure) person to make him טָהוֹר (pure).

This purifying mixture also has a great mystery: It also has the power to make טָמֵא things שָמֵא!

מי חַטָּאת says that if the מִי חַטָּאת mixture is sprinkled on a טָמֵא person, he becomes טָמֵא

The טָהוֹר say that if a טָהוֹר person touches the מי חַטָאת mixture, he becomes טָמֵא

מַכָּמִים and the חַכָּמִים agree that one who even carries the מי חטאת mixture becomes אָמֶא and his clothes also become טָמֵא.
