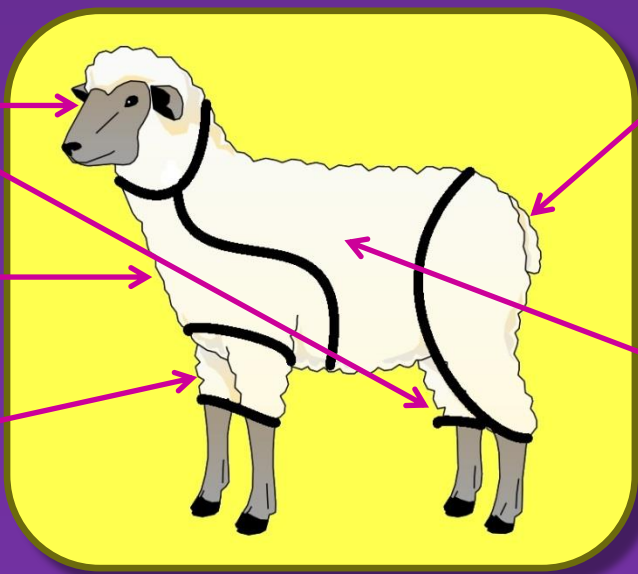

לשכת הגזית - The

Chamber Of Hewn Stone



Where were the lotteries held? In a room called **לשכת הגזית**, (The Chamber of Hewn Stone). This is the same room where the Great Sanhedrin sat in judgement. Another name for this room was 'בְּסִילְקֵי' which means a room built on top of an attic.

The lotteries took place in the east of this Chamber. An elder sat on the west side to oversee it. The כְּהֵנִים stood in a circle (like a tiara), and the lottery conductor came and removed one of the כְּהֵנִים' s hats from his head. He was the כֹּהֵן from whose finger the count would start.
